How veterans use art to focus on healing, recovery[7]

As Americans this week marked Veterans Day, the CU community furthered its support for past and present service members by carrying out the university's mission. From advancing health care and education to fostering community and belonging, CU's commitment to veterans and active-duty service members is carried out across all four campuses.

For one, consider CU Anschutz, where the <u>Marcus Institute for Brain Health (MIBH)</u>[8] stands as a national leader in treating traumatic brain injuries sustained by veterans, active-duty service members and first responders. Its on-site, interdisciplinary team of specialists provides world-class care, helping those in need heal from the invisible wounds of combat and service.

For many, that journey takes an unexpected turn through art. Under the guidance of art therapist <u>Gayla Elliott[9]</u>, patients who may have dismissed creative expression as incompatible with the warrior mindset discover a new way to process and transform their experiences. What begins as skepticism often becomes revelation, as each brushstroke helps unlock emotion, reflection and recovery beyond the blank canvas.

To learn how veterans at CU Anschutz are finding new ways to heal, and how Elliott is helping them turn pain into purpose, explore the long-form story "Reverent Process" [10] by Javan Bair, community engagement specialist at the MIBH. The piece features veterans who found transformation through art.

Regents roundup: New CU Boulder student housing, remembering Regent Emeritus Norwood Robb, more[13]

The CU Board of Regents last week approved plans enabling new CU Boulder student housing, a critical strategic investment in student success, affordability and sustainability.

The approval from the board, which voted during its Nov. 6 meeting at UCCS, allows CU Boulder to enter into a public-private partnership with developer Morgan Stone Everett to construct suite- and apartment-style student housing near the intersection of Colorado Avenue and Regent Drive.

Construction on the project, which is expected to house about 1,650 students, could begin as soon as summer 2026, with a targeted opening in fall 2028.

Regents also voted to approve the launch of a bachelor of science in Integrated Business and Engineering (IBE) degree program jointly developed by the Leeds School of Business and the College of Engineering and Applied Science at CU Boulder. Blending engineering's analytical power with business' strategic insight, the program will produce graduates equipped to lead, innovate and thrive in a rapidly changing, technology-driven world.

Regent Emeritus Norwood "Robby" Robb was honored with the board's passage of a resolution in memoriam. Robb died Aug. 22, 2025, at age 89. Robb, a Colorado Springs native, won election to the board in 1984 and served three terms. During his 18 years representing the 6th Congressional District, he was elected board chair twice and vice chair twice.
